

Minutes of the Littleton Clean Lakes Committee
March 4, 2003

Dan Lord Jon Folsom
Savas Danos was present briefly, then excused himself to attend another meeting.

The committee was called to order at 7 pm. February minutes were accepted as written.

Jon distributed copies of the CLC Annual Report. While the report had already been filed, suggested revisions will be forwarded to the Selectmen.

Long Lake

Cali Corporation submitted a task schedule that will see the Wetland Park completed in mid-May. The committee took no issue with Cali crews working on Saturdays to meet the schedule, provided there would be no additional expense. Cali's contract might be extended to take on the Boat Launch and Town Beach improvements. Retaining Cali could speed the process and keep more funds in the field rather than tied up in bid documents.

Rain Barrels are available at \$45 list, plus \$10 shipping in MA. Savas felt that shipping could be covered as an in-kind service by the LWD and the list price could be reduced an additional \$10 by using [DEM Demonstration Grant](#) Funds, making the cost as low as \$35 a barrel.

Savas announced that the Rain Barrel Subcommittee needs a member from each lake group to handle sales, processing, delivery and follow-up on the town-wide program.

GeoSyntec resubmitted their Monitoring Phase proposal (Task #7). The committee had hoped to see a revision of the entire 9-point Demonstration Grant Proposal. Task #7 was examined and questions were submitted to Savas. Additionally, there was concern that GeoSyntec had yet to advise the Highway Department regarding the Lakeshore Drive paving plan. Finally, questions were raised regarding fulfillment of GeoSyntec's original contract. Ruddy suggested we resolve such issues before proceeding with new work. The situation will be brought up for further discussion next month.

Mill Pond

The Army Corps of Engineers and Environmental Science Services continue their work on the Mill Pond Restoration Project. Initial results are expected later this month.

Spectacle Pond

Dan reports that the Spectacle Pond Association will be appearing before the Conservation Commission this month. Additional information has been requested regarding proposed chemical treatment by Aquatic Control Technology.
