Watch for scams, suspicious activity

LITTLETON – Residents are reminded to watch for potential scam artists following a report today of suspicious activity in town, where two men attempted to gain entry to a home under the guise of testing the water.

Light and Water Department General Manager Savas Danos advised residents that employees always travel in vehicles with the department logo on the doors and also carry photo identification badges. He cautioned to always request identification and, if unsure, to call the department for confirmation. Under no circumstances should anyone allow entry without verifying the purpose of the visit and seeing the department identification.

Danos added that Light and Water personnel always call ahead should they need access to a home. In the case reported to police today, two men in a dark car without a logo or any identification knocked on the door of an elderly woman's home and stated that they needed to test the water. Wisely, the woman refused entry and contacted authorities.
