

Littleton Clean Lakes Committee (LCLC) Meeting Minutes

June 15, 2006

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Jon Folsom at the operations Center at 39 Ayer Road, Littleton, MA

LONG LAKE

- Park and Rec are getting ready to be active on lake with concession stand and boat rentals.
- Going out to bid for 2 new rain gardens.
- Looking into designing and building another retention basin and a parking area off Beach Dr. for Town Beach use, in conjunction with further shoreline dredging and a retention basin at the foot of Emerson Rd. (to capture surface flows that currently drain directly into the cove) - The work would be done after the 2006 summer season
- New signage is needed for the Kiosk
- Jon suggested installation of small water pump on dock for use when watering gardens, could be fun for kids to play with during summer, etc.
- Long Lake has ordered and is expecting delivery of two (2) benches for the wetland park for people to enjoy the park.

Susan Silberberg brought up a concern regarding restroom facilities, or lack thereof. Park and Rec opens facilities after school closes, and closes down when school year reopens. The issue is that many people use the beach before and after the season opens. In the past few weeks (June) as many as up to 100 people have been using the beach without any facilities at their disposal.

Savas suggested the CLC could fund two portable restrooms for use before and after Park and Rec opens other facilities. Moved and seconded.

Discussion was had on dog walkers and the obvious concern for walkers not picking up after their dogs.

SPECTACLE POND

Leon indicated there was very little milfoil, pond looking good otherwise. Treatment for foil ensuing.

MILL POND

No news, but Savas has reached out to Marty Meehan's new aid for assistance in getting Army Corps to move Mill Pond project back onto their agenda. Discussion was had on

whether there were things the CLC or MPC could do without Army Corps. Savas cautioned that if another direction was taken, and it was not the Army Corp's volition, then they may stand aside for duration of any potential project. This would of course negate the AC \$ investment in project.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Savas gave an overview of the amount of funds from the cell towers CLC is collecting. This may increase soon as a third "tenant" is bidding for a position on the cell tower.

Board of selectman recently approved usage for winter months of a new ice melting "paste" or "molasses" like material that uses 40-60% less sand.

Moving forward meetings will be held on the second Thursdays of each month.

Next meeting is tentatively scheduled for Thursday, July 13th, 2006.
